
## **OPPORTUNITIES**AND INVESTMENTS

Clarington is driving investment forward with transformative projects that position the community as a leader in sustainable development and economic progress:

- OPG Darlington New Nuclear Project: This groundbreaking initiative involves constructing
  up to four Small Modular Reactors (SMRs) at the Darlington Nuclear site. The project aims
  to deploy North America's first fleet of Small Modular Reactors, capable of generating
  clean electricity for approximately 1.2 million homes. Site preparation is underway,
  pending regulatory approval.
- Metrolinx GO East Rail Expansion: As part of the Lakeshore East Line extension, this
  project includes new station stops in Courtice and Bowmanville. The expansion promises
  faster, more frequent rail service, reduced travel time, and enhanced connectivity for
  Clarington residents.
- Business Parks: With competitive real estate prices, Clarington's business parks present prime opportunities for investment and growth.
  - Energy Park: A hub of clean energy businesses, home to Ontario Power Generation, East Penn, and Durham York Energy Centre.
  - Science and Technology Park: Poised for expansion, with full services expected by late 2026, this park is set to become a centre for innovation.

Each of these initiatives reflects Clarington's commitment to foster sustainable development, drive economic growth, and elevate the quality of life for all residents. Together, these projects pave the way for a vibrant future.



- The Clean Energy sector is positioned to capitalize on economic opportunities from Ontario Power Generation, including the Darlington Nuclear Station, the Darlington New Nuclear Project (Small Modular Reactors), Medical Isotopes, and supply chain growth.
- Fact: OPG Darlington produces 20% of Ontario's electricity, lifesaving medical isotopes, and is leading one of the world's largest investments in new nuclear power with the development of four small modular reactors.
